Dear AHBC Saints,

Well it is February already. What do you think of when someone says, "It's February"? That's right. Valentine's Day! Valentine's Day can represent a lot of different things to different people. For a child it may be making a card and candy for everyone in your class. For a teenager, it may mean letting a special someone know that you would like to be their boyfriend or girlfriend. For married people it may mean remembering all of the loving reasons that the two of you were married and the courtship that goes with that. For older married people it is a reminder of the longevity of your love for one another. For widows and widowers it may be a remembrances of the love you once had and remembering it so fondly. What more can we ask? Love is the key to it all. It's got to start right here, It's got to start right now







It's been almost a year now since COVID-19 caused businesses, schools, churches, etc., to shut down.

Words like "quarantine", "social distance", "masks required" have become a norm in our vocabulary. Every one of us may have our own personal opinion about all of this, but the long term effects it is having on us is unreal. Of course, we will never know until later down the road what those effects are.

However, we see several effects now.

Depression is at an all-time high. Teens, and many adults, are stuck on social media more now than ever. No social interaction, no talking, just a screen to look at. I am seeing the effects of this in the youth room. Kids don't know how to have a meaningful conversation with someone. Isolation doesn't help. Along with depression comes the thoughts of self-harm and suicide. This is a touchy subject, I know, but it's something we need to acknowledge. I know COVID-19 is real, but we cannot ignore the fact that social distancing and isolation has been just as, or even more harmful, than the virus itself. If you are struggling with this, please don't ignore it. I pray you have the courage to reach out and ask for help. There are people that are willing to walk with you to get through this. You are not alone. The Apostle Paul was dealing with this very same thing. We read in 1 Corinthians 1:8-10

"We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters.

About the troubles we

experienced in the province of Asia. We were under great pressure, far beyond our ability to endure, so that we despaired of life itself. Indeed, we felt we had the sentence of death. But this happened that we might not rely on ourselves but on God, who raises the dead. He has delivered us from such a deadly peril, and he will deliver us again. On Him, we have set our hope that He will continue to deliver us."

We gain a lot of hope in this scripture. First, Paul said, "We do not want you to be uninformed...". Paul knew the importance of getting help. He wanted the readers to know how to pray for him and how their prayers comforted him during these trials. It's okay not to be okay, it's not okay to stay that way. You are not alone; we are here to help you. Second, the pressure that Paul felt caused him to think about death. In Paul's words, it was "Far beyond his ability to endure". Do you hear the depression and the thoughts of not wanting to live anymore? I hear it in many conversations I have with people on a weekly basis. We were not meant to battle our trials on our own. Third, Paul knew that he alone could not rely on himself to get better. You cannot rely on yourself either. Like Paul, you have to rely on God who "Raises the Dead." Fourth, know that God will continue to hold you up when you feel depressed and down. You have to just trust Him and put yourself in the palm of His hands and know He will protect you. What a beautiful picture...right? It's true, God knows exactly what is going on with you, He knows how you feel, and He cares for you. You are not forgotten. So church, I know we have to be mindful of COVID-19. I know we have to take persuasions. But let's not ignore the effects all this is having on people. I'm so proud of AHBC! We are pushing forward in ministry. Thank You! Our community is hurting and they need to see a glimpse of God who can deliver them from their depression. Let's not ignore the issue...it's real, just like the virus. If you are struggling or know of someone who is, please don't ignore it either. May God bless all of you. In Christ, Haynes


